COVID-19 Data Summary for the Southwestern Pennsylvania Region Periods covering September to October




Key Takeaways

- As of Thursday, October 15, Allegheny County's rate of COVID-19 cases per 100,000 residents remains less than half the national rate.
- From September to October, the increase in the number of cases per 100,000 in Allegheny County was less than the U.S. and compared favorably against benchmark regions.
- Regionally, the rate of new COVID-19 cases over a 14 day period (10/1 to 10/15) has increased 67.6%. Butler, Lawrence and Westmoreland have seen the largest increases.
- Daily new cases for the region have increased 123.4% from 10/1 to 10/15.
- In Allegheny County, hospitalizations have increased 7.5% between 10/1 and 10/15, which is an improvement from the 14-day hospitalization increase of 11.3% reported in the previous analysis released 9/17/20 analyzing the period between 9/2 and 9/16.

Allegheny County still compares favorably to its benchmark regions in terms of COVID-19 infection rates, although Seattle now ranks lower. However, Allegheny County's rate remains less than half the national rate.


Cases per 100,000 residents as of 10/15/20

On an absolute basis, the increase in the number of cases/100,000 in Allegheny County from September to October was less than the U.S. and compared favorably to the benchmark regions. However, the percentage increase in cases/100,000 was only slightly below the national average and below five benchmark regions.




All counties in the region with the exception of Greene County have increased new cases of COVID-19 per 100,000 in the fourteen day period between Oct 1 and Oct 15. The regional rate of COVID-19 per 100K exceeds the state (67.6% to 42.6%). However, within the region, seven of ten counties within the region are below the regional rate.

Westmoreland has experienced a 224.5% increase in cases in the fourteen day period between 10/1 and 10/15. Though Indiana has increased cases, the rate of cases has not grown as much as Westmoreland, Lawrence (193.8%) or Butler (127.6%). Indiana has the smallest percentage increase in cases at 15.3%. Greene has decreased 28.0%.


Fourteen Day Sum New Cases per 100K population as of 10/15/20




Red – 14-Day increase Blue – 14-Day decrease



Though Allegheny, Beaver, Washington, Fayette, and Greene counties each have below 100 cases per 100K as of 10/15, the number of new cases per 100K population has been increasing. The remaining five counties are all above 100 cases per 100K.


Daily new cases have increased from 14 days prior, with the most dramatic change occurring in Westmoreland (+572.7%), Fayette (+333.3%), and Butler (+237.5%). Data was not shared on October 3, and October 4 includes two days of data.


For the region, daily new cases have increased 123.4% from October 1 to October 15.

New Cases by Day - 10-County Region



In Allegheny County, new cases over the past 14 days per 100,000 increased from 96.69 on Wednesday, October 14 to 99.38 on Wednesday, October 15. The 14 day sum of new cases per 100K increased 2.8% between October 14 and October 15, part of a larger upward trend of 29.0% from October 1. The number of new cases has increased, as have hospitalizations, though hospitalizations is at a lower rate.
